Sunday of Easter is traditionally designated as "Good Shepherd Sunday; so, on Sunday, May 11, we will be reading from chapter 22 of John's gospel when Jesus tells the crowd in

the Temple, "The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me, but you do not believe because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish."

In such a time like this, we are bombarded by all kinds of voices and, unfortunately, the loud angry voices are the only ones we hear. That's why, more than ever, we need to stop and listen very carefully. As Elijah learned when he retreated to his mountain hideaway, God did not speak in the wind or earthquake or storm; God spoke in a

speaks to you is a word of love then it's of God. Fear, anger, judgment are not how God speaks. That is how the people of God thought they heard God speak in the Old Testament. But, even though prophets heard God speak judgment, they believed that in the end God always spoke forgiveness and mercy. As the prophet Jonah admitted, "I knew that you are a God who is kind and shows mercy. You don't become angry quickly. You have great love. I knew you would rather forgive than punish..."

That's the voice of the Good Shepherd. Jesus showed us that God is merciful and loving through his life and ministry. When the religious leaders accused Jesus of eating with sinners, Jesus replied, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." Unfortunately, it seems that our leaders today are more like the religious leaders of Jesus' day WHEN they judge and condemn and oppress others.

The voice of the Good Shepherd is a voice of hope in the midst of hopelessness and despair. When Martha was overwhelmed by grief at the death of her brother, Lazarus, she heard the Good Shepherd speak. As John tells us in his gospel, "Martha said to Jesus, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died...' Jesus said to her, 'Your brother will rise again."Then, he added, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

DO YOU BÉLIEVE THIS? In such a time like this, the world needs to hear the voice of the Good Shepherd. It seems obvious that people today do not and cannot hear his voice because they do not believe and belong to God's flock. So, more than ever, Christ's sheep need to be visible and present. We do not need to be another voice shouting into the cacophony of voices already screaming to be heard. Like the still small voice that Elijah heard, we can live out the call of Micah, "And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." ACTION WILL SPEAK LOUDER THAN WORDS!

Food Pantry: The Food Pantry was blessed by 1200 pounds of food from the Portland Food Project on April 12th. Thanks to those who volunteered at the pick up site (Marie, Marcia, Cheryl, Skip, and Sherry) and those who got the bags in the pantry areas (Karen O, Marcia's family, Sherry, and Cheryl). That said as of April 25th we are very low on food. even with other donations and PFP. We had a Krispy Kremes employee stop with a donut donation filling 1 1/2 refrigerator freezers. We had neighbors come by with wagons of food and the daughter of a deceased member bring food. There are extraordinary stories of a woman with legs amputated using her scooter and making it in the pantry, a gentleman who had been coming weekly who has an apartment now with the help of Northwest Pilot Proiect. We continue to meet an extraordinary need. We served 223 people in April, some are returning visitors each week. Praise the Lord.

Cultivate Initiatives: Join Cultivate Initiatives for an Eat and Greet on May 23rd 5-8p.m. Free food, live music, petting zoo and good times.

Lenten Discipline Results: Our giving for Lent by donating a piece of gently used clothing was a great success. We donated 12 bags and 5 boxes to Cultivate Initiatives and 86 pounds to Snow-Cap. Great idea, Cathy H.
