



Happy Valentine's Day!

Depending on who you ask, today is either a beautiful celebration of romance or a high-pressure deadline to buy overpriced roses. It consistently ranks in the top four holidays for candy and greeting card sales, but the origins of this day are far grittier than a box of truffles. Back in the third century CE, Roman Emperor Claudius II (often called "Claudius the Cruel," which tells you he wasn't great at parties) decided that single men made better soldiers if they didn't have wives or kids to think about and they'd fight with more reckless abandon. His

solution? He banned marriage. It was a bold, if slightly cynical, human resources strategy. That's when Valentine entered the picture. Refusing to let the Emperor's "no-romance" policy stand, Valentine became a sort of underground wedding planner. He secretly married couples in hidden locations, risking his life so young men could trade their spears for wedding bands. Eventually, the law caught up with him. When he refused to recant his beliefs, he was executed on February 14th, 270 CE. So, the next time you're stressed about a dinner reservation, remember: Valentine literally died so you could have a "plus one."

Fast forward to the 1960s, when Burt Bacharach gave us the ultimate earworm: "What the world needs now is love, sweet love." It's a catchy sentiment, but pop music has a habit of turning deep truths into sugary wallpaper. We often mistake "love" for a vague, fuzzy feeling—the kind that evaporates the moment someone cuts us off in traffic.

Maybe that's what has happened to the "Gospel." Bacharach's lyrics mirrored Jesus' message, but distorted it with mushy sentiment. While the song provided the words, the good news Jesus brought was about action. He "walked the talk:" healing the sick, restoring sight, and comforting the social outcasts. In an era where we seem increasingly polarized, angry, and ready to argue with strangers on the internet, that brand of active love is more than a nice idea—it's a necessity. The struggle isn't exactly new. Since the dawn of time (or at least since the Tree of Knowledge incident), humanity has struggled with a specific sickness: wanting to be in control. When we try to play God, everything tends to fall apart. Our self-centeredness produces a predictable, bitter fruit: anger, division, greed, injustice, and fear.

That said we have 2 opportunities for Feb--PFP regular volunteer and pick up is on Feb. 14th. Come to the church to help unload food or to Open Door at 9:30 to help with the distribution.
